YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEES (YACS) AND PEER-TO-PEER SERVICES:

Each committee reflects a youth community in Ottawa. We aim to provide service, advocacy, and awareness to and for these communities through the work we do. Across YSB's wide spectrum of youth engagement services, the following teams and committees are presently operating. They focus on advocating and creating programs and services for youth living in Ottawa.

ETHNO-CULTURAL YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE (EYAC)

focuses on creating a more culturally sensitive Ottawa by educating teachers, youth workers, and the general public on the barrier newcomer youth face. EYAC also hosts spaces that empower individuals for their diverse backgrounds by hosting events that celebrate cultural diversity. EYAC supports newcomer youth directly through skills development and assistance with their integration into Canada.

PURPLE SISTERS

Purple Sisters is a committee of young women who reach out to other young women with the goal of empowering one another. They host monthly events at YSB's Young Women's Space that engage and celebrate young women, create resources, and deliver workshops to the community. They bring their voice to issues that affect them.

WESTEND YOUTH MOTIVATORS

Westend Youth Motivators (WEYM) are a committee of youth from diverse cultural backgrounds, who are committed to making a difference within the Pinecrest-Queensway area neighbourhoods. Our focus is to identify issues related to youth by bringing awareness and advocacy to youth, service providers, and other decision makers.

QUEER YOUTH ACTION COMMITTEE

This committee is made up of two subcommittees:

RAINBOW YAC

Rainbow Youth Advisory Committee (RYAC) aims to empower youth from the lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer & gender queer (LGBTQ) community through the implementation of events and workshops that educate this group as well as provide a safe(r) space for them to come together, share, dance, learn, and connect.

SPECTRUM YOUTH LEADERS

Spectrum Youth Leaders are a group of youth volunteers that provide peer-to-peer leadership to the weekly Spectrum Drop-In program. Spectrum Drop-In provides services to LGBTQ youth in Ottawa including workshops, discussion groups, and art collaborations, as well as counseling services, peer mentoring, and primary care resources.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

YSB has a team of experienced counsellors, with access to a multi-disciplinary team. They offer welcoming, non-judgmental services for youth and families. All services are free and accessible in both official languages.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH WALK-IN CLINIC 613-562-3004

The walk-in clinic offers direct access to a single counselling session for youth 12 to 20 years of age, and/or their parents, without having to make an appointment. Open Tuesdays & Thursdays from noon to 8 p.m. Last appointment at 6 p.m.

COUNSELLING SERVICES

This service offers youth (12 up to their 18th birthday) and their families the chance to address issues like family conflict, relationships, anxiety, depression, violence, sexual orientation, loss and bereavement. Counselling services include youth and caregiver groups, family counselling, and individual sessions for youth. We also offer school-based brief counselling services in dedicated schools in Ottawa.

INTENSIVE FAMILY SUPPORT 613-562-3004

This service offers intensive support to families in their homes to address youth issues (ages 12 to the age of 18).

WRAPAROUND OTTAWA 613-562-3004

Wraparound is a youth and family based planning process that develops an individualized plan that uses the strengths of the youth/family and their team members to develop strategies that the whole team takes on that effectively address the youth /family's complex needs.

CENTRE ÉDUCATIF/ DAY TREATMENT

This academic and therapeutic day treatment program is for francophone teens from ages 12 to 15 whose behaviours are interfering with their success in school. Referrals for this program are school-driven and managed through the Coordinated Access Committee.

They include home-based crisis support in the Ottawa area, a mobile counselling team, a residential crisis unit for short stays, and a crisis chat service available 24/7 at CHAT.YSB.CA.

Housing Plus helps youth ages 16 to 20 to find and maintain safe housing and know their rights. Trusteeship helps 16 and 17 year olds receive Ontario Works benefits. In person at 147 Besserer St., Tuesday to Friday 12 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Finding a job can be stressful and frustrating at times, but we can make it easier for you to successfully enter or re-enter the workplace. Employment Services offer job seekers of all ages support to prepare for the job market and find employment. Services include career counselling, interview preparation, job fairs, and job placements. We also work with employers to match people and job opportunities.

YOUTH JOB CONNECTION (YJC CORE), FULLTIME

YJC Core offers intensive, specialized support to youth aged 15-29 who are not in work, school, or training and who face multiple barriers to employment.

- At least 60 hours of paid training to prepare youth for the workplace
- Jobs for up to six months, with support and funding for employers

YOUTH JOB CONNECTION (YJC AFTERSCHOOL), PARTTIME, SEPTEMBER-JUNE

YJC Afterschool provides job training and support opportunities and parttime job placements during the school year to help multibarriered high school students, aged 15 -18, make positive educational and career choices.

- Up to 20 hours of paid training to prepare youth for the workplace
- Part time jobs up to 10 hrs/week, with support and funding for employers

YOUTH JOB CONNECTION (YJC SUMMER), APRIL-AUGUST

- YJC Summer provides summer job opportunities and parttime job placements during the summer months to help multibarriered high school students, aged 15 -18, make positive educational and career choices.
- Up to 20 hours of paid training to prepare youth for the workplace
- Fulltime or parttime jobs for up to 8 weeks over the summer months
- Support and funding for employers

YOUTH JOB LINK

A series of workshops throughout the year that any youth, aged 15-29, can attend.

- Workshops, including career exploration, career management, job search, and job readiness
- Support to connect youth with employment opportunities, including summer jobs
- Potential incentives to employers to help cover the cost of wages and hiring supports

YOUTH JUSTICE SERVICES

YSB's youth justice programs provide young men the knowledge, training and counselling they need to make positive life choices. Our residential programs at the William E. Hay Centre and Sherwood Centre help youth in conflict with the law complete high school credits and receive valuable life skills training. The Youth Services Bureau focuses on helping youth make a positive transition back into the community.

WILLIAM E. HAY CENTRE

The Hay Centre is a 40-bed residence for male youth ages 12 to 17 in pre-trial detention or post-trial secure custody.

LIVIUS SHERWOOD DETENTION AND CUSTODY CENTRE

The Sherwood Centre is an 8-bed residence for male youth ages 12 to 17 in pre-trial detention or post-trial open custody.

ANGER MANAGEMENT

This program provides 5-7 one-on-one sessions to help youth find strategies to better cope with the negative impact of anger and teach healthy ways to express anger. By referral only.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH COURT WORKER

This program redirects youth with mental health issues who are in conflict with the law towards the programs and services they and their families need. By referral only.

COMMUNITY REINTEGRATION PROGRAM

This voluntary program helps youth address factors likely to cause criminal behaviours, in order to reduce the likelihood of reoffending. The reintegration worker works with youth to create healthier relationships and build a better future. The services can include individual, couple, or family sessions to address issues such as substance use, relationships, education, and employment. By referral only.

TRANSITIONAL YOUTH JUSTICE WORKER

This program provides support for youth transitioning from custody or detention back into their community. The transitional youth justice worker facilitates life skills and helps support the youth in acquiring housing, applying for social benefits, and acquiring identification. The transitional youth justice worker also links the youth with community resources for longer term support.
